We **object** to Policy DS3 'Open Countryside' on the basis that the proposed employment land strategy is not justified or supported by appropriate evidence. The plan policies and related evidence base do not identify sufficient employment land to address the needs of South Staffordshire during the Local Plan period and as such flexibility is required in Policy DS3 to enable additional sites to come forward to address the identified need.

Policy DS3 seeks to control development in the open countryside, which is identified as land being outside of the Green Belt and defined settlement development boundaries.

It is stressed that the Local Plan emphasises the need to 'ensure there is sufficient supply of employment land to meet the needs of the district over the plan period' (policy EC1 Sustainable Economic Growth), along with contributing towards the employment needs of the wider functional economic market area (FEMA) arising from the Black Country authorities. This is key to the achieving the Local Plan's Economic Prosperity Strategic Objective and wider Local Plan Vision.

Based on the findings of its Economic Development Needs Assessment, SSDC has concluded that the existing supply of available employment land and proposed allocations in the plan are enough to ensure there is a sufficient supply of employment land for the plan period. However, in light of the conclusions of the Savills Industrial and Logistics Needs Assessment



(attached as Appendix A), it is considered that there is a significant shortfall of employment land in South Staffordshire of between 76 ha and 257 ha, based on the scenarios considered. As such it is maintained that insufficient employment sites are allocated within the Local Plan. Further allocations are required to meet the needs of the district and wider FEMA in the plan period, to make the Local Plan sound, as detailed in our representations made to Chapter 3 of the Local Plan.

As detailed in our representations to Policy SA7, the Council's own assessment of potential employment sites identifies that due to the limited supply of brownfield land in South Staffordshire, all of the potential sites identified were located in either the Green Belt or open countryside. As such, to provide the required additional employment sites, rural sites in the open countryside will be required.

To ensure that South Staffordshire's future employment needs are met, Policy DS3 should be amended to provide sufficient flexibility to enable the delivery of additional employment sites in the open countryside (outside of the Green Belt), as and when required to address the identified needs of SSDC and the wider FEMA. This is particularly import due to the unresolved issues and uncertainty with the South Staffordshire FEMA and Black Country's duty to cooperate position.

This approach has been implemented by North West Leicestershire in its Local Plan, adopted in March 2021 following a partial review to address unmet housing and employment need in the district. Policy EC2 'New Employment Sites' in part 1 refers to specific allocations but goes on to include the following Part 2 text:

- 2) Where evidence indicates an immediate need or demand for additional employment land (B1, B2 and B8) in North West Leicestershire that cannot be met from land allocated in this plan, the Council will consider favourably proposals that meet the identified need in appropriate locations subject to the proposal:
- (a) Being accessible or will be made accessible by a choice of means of transport, including sustainable transport modes, as a consequence of planning permission being granted for the development; and
- (b) Having good access to the strategic highway network (M1, M42/A42 and A50) and an acceptable impact on the capacity of that network, including any junctions; and
- (c) Not being detrimental to the amenities of any nearby residential properties or the wider environment.

As set out in the policy's explanatory text, part 2 is required to address the identified shortfall in the local authorities HEDNA in respect to identified employment land. The Inspector's Report for the Local Plan review considered that the employment policies proposed were appropriate given, not only the identified shortfall in North West Leicestershire, but also the uncertainty in relation to the needs of the wider area and the unresolved requirement to complete a Statement of Common ground with other authorities in the FEMA.

It is maintained that based on the existing supply of available employment land and allocations identified within the Local Plan, there will be an undersupply of land for the plan period. As such Policy DS3 has not been positively prepared as it does not meet the area's objectively assessed needs.

It is also noted that there is no agreed Duty to Cooperate position with the FEMA in relation to employment land. Therefore the Local Plan, and Policy DS3, are not informed by agreements with other authorities, as to whether unmet employment need from neighbouring areas is accommodated where it is practical to do so and is consistent with achieving sustainable development.

It is requested that the following additional text be included in Policy DS3 as a penultimate paragraph in the policy:

Where evidence indicates an immediate need or demand for additional employment land (E(g), B2 and B8) that cannot be met from land allocated in this plan, the Council will consider favourably proposals that meet the identified need in appropriate locations outside of the district's settlements in the open countryside, subject to proposals:

- a. <u>Being accessible or will be made accessible by a choice of means of transport, including sustainable transport modes, as a consequence of planning permission being granted for the development; and</u>
- b. <u>Having good access to the strategic highway network (M6 motorway) and an acceptable impact on the capacity of that network, including any junctions; and</u>
- c. <u>Not being detrimental to the amenities of any nearby residential properties or the wider environment.</u>

It is also requested that the third paragraph of Policy DS3 be amended as follows to provide the flexibility needed to address the employment needs of South Staffordshire:

All types of development in the Open Countryside which are not explicitly supported by Policy DS3 will be considered on a case-by-case basis. Such proposals will only be permitted where they are not located on best and most versatile agricultural land where the benefits of the scheme outweigh the economic and other benefits of that agricultural land and are fully consistent with any other relevant policies set out elsewhere in the Local Plan. These include, but are not limited to, policies which relate to the district's:

- overall development strategy
- design standards
- landscape character and assets
- historic assets
- ecological assets and biodiversity
- recreational assets



- -housing mix requirements (where applicable)
- sustainable travel requirements
