The proposed plan period is 2023 to 2041. Paragraph 22 of the Framework requires Local Plans to have a "minimum" 15 year plan period from the point of adoption. As a consequence, the South Staffordshire Local Plan must be adopted in 2026 at the latest in order for this requirement is to be met.

Table 1 – Stages of Plan Making, of the consultation draft Plan advises that it is expected that the Plan will be adopted in "February 2026". There is, therefore, no scope for the plan making process to slip. In our experience the plan making process is often delayed, and there is a real danger that the emerging Plan will not have a minimum 15 year plan period. There is a strong possibility of a change in Government this year which is likely to result in further changes to the plan making system and the reversal of the December 2023 amendments to the NPPF; the consequences of such changes could delay the adoption of the local Plan.

The plan period should therefore be kept under review. If the Plan period does need to be extended to account for any slippage in its adoption date, resulting in additional allocations, the Council could explore the potential for increasing the size and the capacity of the proposed housing allocation at Pattingham (Site 251). Our clients are owners of land which adjoins Site 251 at its southern boundary and could be considered for residential development.
