Paragraphs 147 of the NPPF makes comments about reviewing Green Belt boundaries and promoting substantive patterns of development. The paragraph states, "They should also set out ways in which the impact of remaining land from the Green Belt can be offset through compensatory improvements to the environmental quality and accessibility of remaining green belt land".

No further guidance is provided as to what this would entail or how this should be provided/maintained and determined if there is a threshold/quantity that should be provided.

Policy DS2 advises on compensatory improvements being incorporated into Section 106 agreements and sets out a hierarchy of where this can be accommodated. There is also reference to a commuted sum being suggested in some instances.

However, there is no indication as to what the amount of compensation either monetary or otherwise would be.

Further guidance at this stage should also be set out explaining how the compensatory improvements to the environmental quality and accessibility to remain Green Belt relate to biodiversity net gain and the duplication of compensation.
